Tobacco Growers Protection Ordinance, 1933 Ordinance 2 of 1933

Published in Official Gazette 515 on 6 June 1933

Assented to on 5 June 1933

Commenced on 6 June 1933

[Amended by <u>Tobacco Growers Protection Amendment</u> <u>Ordinance, 1933 (Ordinance 7 of 1933)</u> on 23 August 1933]

To provide for the control of the importation and sale of tobacco used for farming purposes, as a measure of protection for the growers of tobacco in this Territory.

(Afrikaans text signed by the Administrator)

[The provisions in this Ordinance have no headings.]

BE IT ORDAINED by the Legislative Assembly for the Territory of South West Africa as follows:-

1.

(1) No person shall introduce or cause to be introduced into the Territory lick and dip tobacco except under the authority of a permit issued by the Secretary for South West Africa or by some person authorised by him.

The Secretary or such authorised person may issue such permit subject to such conditions as he may deem fit.

[The format of subsection (1) is reproduced as it appears in the Official Gazette.]

(2) Such permit shall state the quantity of tobacco the importation of which it authorises, the names and addresses of the seller and purchaser thereof, the approximate date of the intended importation and the route and means of conveyance by which the consignment is to travel.

2.

No person shall sell lick or dip tobacco unless it has been treated in a manner prescribed by regulation. Such regulations may be made by the Administrator.

Any person who contravenes or evades the provisions of this Ordinance or any condition attached to the issue of a permit under section one, shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period not exceeding six months.

[A fine not exceeding fifty pounds is equivalent to a fine not exceeding N\$100.]

This Ordinance may be cited as the Tobacco Growers Protection Ordinance, 1933.
