
The order:

1. The application for leave to appeal is refused.

Reasons for order:

JANUARY J

- 1. The applicant was convicted of murder (dolus eventualis).
- 2. This court found that he did not act in self-defence as he testified that he cut the deceased with a panga because of anger. Witnesses testified that at the critical moment they did not see an attack on the applicant. The deceased had no weapon
- 3. I am not convinced that another court will come to a different conclusion.
- 4. The sentence is not startlingly inappropriate and does not induce a sense of shock in the circumstances.
- There is no reasonable prospects of success on appeal and I am not convinced that a court of appeal may take a different view. (See: *Munyama v S* (CC 62/2007) [2011] NAHC 23 (14 February 2011).
