In terms of section 13 of the Townships and Division of Land Ordinance, 1963 (Ordinance No. 11 of 1963), I hereby declare the area situated on Portion 33 of the farm Otjiwarongo Townlands South No. 308, in the Municipal Area of Otjiwarongo, Registration Division "D" and represented by General Plan D86 (A813/99) to be an approved township.
