AMENDMENT OF LONG-TERM INSURANCE REGULATIONS, 1998: LONG-TERM INSURANCE ACT, 1998

The Minister of Finance has under section 72 of the Long-term Insurance Act, 1998 (Act No. 5 of 1998), made the regulations set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

1. In these regulations "the Regulations" means the Long-term Insurance Regulations, 1998, published under Government Notice No. 145 of 18 June 1998.

2. Annexure A to the Regulations is hereby amended -

(a) in subitem (1) of item 2 -

(i) by the substitution in paragraph (a) for the amount "N\$68 000" of the amount "N\$126 500";

(ii) by the substitution in paragraph (b) for the amounts "N\$68 000" and "N\$115 000" of the amounts "N\$126 500" and "N\$218 000", respectively;

(iii) by the substitution in paragraph (c) for the amounts "N\$115 000" and "N\$250 000" of the amounts "N\$218 000" and "N\$471 000", respectively;

(iv) by the substitution in paragraph (d) for the amounts "N\$250 000" and "N\$770 000" of the amounts "N\$471 000" and "N\$1 380 000", respectively; and

(v) by the substitution in paragraph (c) for the amount "N\$770 000" of the amount "N\$1 380 000"; and

(b) in subitem (2) of item 2 by the substitution for the amount "N\$3 450" of the amount "N\$5 000".

ELECTRICITY ACT, 2000 (ACT NO. 2 OF 2000): NOTICE OF EXTENSION OF TIME UNDER SECTION 41 OF THE ELECTRICITY ACT, 2000

Under section 41 of the Electricity Act, 2000, I extend the period of 12 months referred to in that section within which a person who, upon the date of commencement of the Electricity Act, 2000, carried on an undertaking for the generation, transmission, distribution, import or export of electricity under authorization obtained in terms of the Electric Power Proclamation 1922 (Proclamation No. 4 of 1922) was allowed to carry on such undertaking for a further period of three months commencing on 12 July 2001 and ending on 12 October 2001. On the last-mentioned date such person shall be required to be the holder of an appropriate licence issued in terms of the Electricity Act, 2000, in respect of the activities carried on in such undertaking.

ELECTRICITY ACT, 2000:
IMPOSITION OF LEVY ON ELECTRICITY

The Minister of Mines and Energy, under section 13 of the Electricity Act, 2000 (Act No. 2 of 2000), imposes a levy on electricity on NamPower as a Transmission licensee, with effect from 1 July 2001, as set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Amount of Levy

1. The amount of the levy imposed is 0.45 cents per kilowatt of electricity supplied per hour.

Times for payment of levy

2. The levy is payable monthly in arrears in respect of the amount of electricity supplied during the month and must be paid to the Electricity Control Board established under section 2 of the Electricity Act, 2000, not later than -

- (a) the 15th day of the month following the month in respect of which the levy is payable; or
- (b) if that day falls on a Saturday, a Sunday or a public holiday, the first business day thereafter;

Interest on late payment

3. If the amount payable in respect of the levy is not paid by NamPower in accordance with paragraph (2), by the last day for payment as stipulated in that paragraph, NamPower shall pay interest on the outstanding amount, compounded, daily, from the date following that last day at a rate equivalent to the normal annual interest rate charged by commercial banks in Namibia on overdraft accounts, and subject to any fluctuation in that rate, during the period that the amount in question or any portion thereof remains unpaid.

SEA FISHERIES ACT, 1992 (ACT NO. 29 OF 1992):
DETERMINATION OF QUOTA FEES

Under section 20 of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1992 (Act No. 29 of 1992), and with the concurrence of the Minister of Finance, I hereby -

- (a) determine that the fees as set out in the Schedule is payable in respect of quotas allocated under section 16 of the Act; and
- (b) withdraw Government Notice No. 85 of 15 May 1999.

SCHEDULE

1. In this notice any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Sea Fisheries Act, 1992 (Act No. 29 of 1992), has that meaning and, unless the context otherwise indicates -

“hake” means any fish of the species *Merluccius capensis* or *Merluccius paradoxus*;

“horse mackerel” means any fish of the genus *Trachurus*;

“pilchard” means any fish of the species *Sardinops ocellata*;

“monk” means any fish of the species *Lophius vomerinus*;

“seals” means any seal of the species *Arctocephalus pusillus pusillus*;

“red crab” means any crab of the species *Chaceon maritae*;

“rock lobster” means any lobster of the species *Jasus lalandii*;

“orange roughy” means any fish of the species *Hoplostethus atlanticus*;

“Namibia vessel”, except a Midwater Trawl Industry vessel, means a fishing vessel -

- (a) which is registered or licensed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1951 (Act No. 57 of 1951);
- (b) which is permanently based in Namibia;
- (c) which flies the Namibian flag;
- (d) of which at least 51% of the beneficial ownership is held by Namibian citizens; and
- (e) of which at least 85% of the crew on board at all times while the vessel is operating under quota, are Namibian citizens;

“Namibian - based vessel” except a Midwater Trawl Industry vessel, means a fishing vessel -

- (a) which is registered or licensed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1951 (Act No. 57 of 1951);
- (b) which is permanently based in Namibia;
- (c) which flies the Namibian flag;
- (d) of which at least 51% of the beneficial ownership is held by Namibian citizens; and
- (e) of which the crew includes Namibian citizens but being less than 85% of the crew; or a
- (f) foreign flagged vessel with at least 85% Namibian crew;

“Namibian vessel” means with regard to a Midwater Trawl Industry vessel, a fishing vessel -

- (a) which is registered or licensed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1951 (Act No. 57 of 1951);
- (b) which is permanently based in Namibia;
- (c) which flies the Namibian flag;
- (d) of which at least 51% of the beneficial ownership is held by Namibian citizens; and
- (e) of which 35% of the crew on board at all times while the vessel is operating under the quota are Namibian citizens;

“Namibian - based vessel” means with regard to a Midwater Trawl Industry vessel, a fishing vessel -

- (a) which is registered or licensed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1951 (Act No. 57 of 1951);
- (b) which is permanently based in Namibia;
- (c) which flies the Namibian flag;
- (d) of which at least 51% of the beneficial ownership is held by Namibian citizens; and

- (e) of which the crew includes Namibian citizens, but being less than 35% of the number of the crew; or a
 (f) foreign flagged vessel with at least 35% Namibian crew;

“foreign flagged vessel” means a foreign flagged vessel other than such vessel included in the definition of a ‘Namibian vessel’ or a ‘Namibian - based vessel’ contained in the definition section of this notice.

2. Every person to whom a quota is allocated after 1 July 2001, under section 16 of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1992 (Act No. 29 of 1992), must, in respect of any of the species of fish mentioned below, pay in respect of every metric ton of the species of fish so allocated after 1 July 2001, the appropriate fee specified opposite to such species set out below:

3. The quota fee payable in terms of paragraph 2, in respect of the year for which the quota has been allocated, must be paid to the Permanent Secretary: Fisheries and Marine Resources, Private Bag 13355, Windhoek, in four equal instalments, calculated in accordance with the formula set out in paragraph 4, which instalments may not be paid later than -

- first instalment, the 15th day in the last month of the first quarter;
- second instalment, the 15th day in the last month of the second quarter;
- third instalment, the 15th day in the last month of the third quarter; and
- fourth instalment, the last day of the fourth quarter, of the year for which the quota has been allocated.

4. For the purposes of calculating the amount of the instalments referred to in paragraph 3, the following formula must be applied -

$$\frac{Q \times F}{4}; \text{ where}$$

Q = the total quota allocation in metric tons; and

F = the quota fee applicable in terms of paragraph 2.

5. Each payment made in terms of paragraph 3, must be accompanied by appropriate documentary proof of the category of vessel used, as well as documentary proof, countersigned by a fishery control officer, verifying the quantity of fish landed in Namibia. Should proof be insufficient, the highest fee specified in paragraph 2 in respect of the species of fish, without any rebate, applies and is payable.
