It is hereby made known -

- (a) in terms of section 22(2) of the Roads Ordinance, 1972 (Ordinance 17 of 1972), that the Minister has, in the district of Tsumeb under section 22(1)(b) of the said Ordinance declared the road described in the Schedule and shown on sketch-map P2105 by the symbols A-B, to be a proclaimed road.
- (b) in terms of section 23(3) of the said Ordinance that the Minister has under section 23(1)(c) of the said Ordinance declared the road referred to in paragraph (a) to be a district road (number 3649).

The said sketch-map shall at all times lie open to inspection at the office of the Roads Authority, Windhoek, during normal office hours.

CLOSING OF A PORTION OF TRUNK ROAD 10/1 AND THE RECLASSIFICATION OF A PORTION OF TRUNK ROAD 10/1 TO A PORTION OF MAIN ROAD 88: DISTRICT OF KEETMANSHOOP

It is hereby made known -

- (a) in terms of section 22(2) of the Roads Ordinance, 1972 (Ordinance 17 of 1972), that the Minister has under section 22(1)(b) of the said Ordinance, in the district of Keetmanshoop, closed a portion of trunk road 10/1 described in Schedule I and shown on sketch-map P2114 by the symbols B-C.
- (b) in terms of section 23(3) of the said Ordinance that the Minister has under section 23(1)(e) of the said Ordinance amended the classification of a portion of trunk road 10/1 described in Schedule II and shown on sketch-map P2114 by the symbols A-B to a portion of main road 88.

The said sketch-map shall at all times lie open to inspection at the office of the Roads Authority, Windhoek, during normal office hours.

From a point (C on sketch-map P2117) at the junction with main road 110 generally northwards to a point (D on sketch-map P2117) at the place known as Epinga.

#### **SCHEDULE III**

From a point (E on sketch-map P2117) at the junction with district road 3608 generally northwards and more and more castwards to a point (E1 on sketch-map P2117); thence generally southwards to a point (F on sketch-map P2117) at the junction with district road 3608.

### **SCHEDULE IV**

From a point (G on sketch-map P2117) at the junction with trunk road 1/11 generally east-north-eastwards and more and more south-eastwards to a point (H on sketch-map P2117) at the junction with district road 3625.

### **SCHEDULE V**

# AGRONOMIC INDUSTRY ACT, 1992: IMPOSITION OF GENERAL LEVY ON CERTAIN CATEGORIES OF CONTROLLED PRODUCTS

Under section 18(1) of the Agronomic Industry Act, 1992 (Act No. 20 of 1992), and on the recommendation of the Namibian Agronomic Board, I impose a general levy on certain categories of controlled products as set out in the Schedule.

I repeal Government Notice No. 145 of 30 August 2002.

#### H. ANGULA MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE, WATER AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT

#### **SCHEDULE**

- 1. A person who produces and sells for his or her benefit wheat or white maize seeds shall pay a general levy of one comma four percent (1,4%) on the selling price thereof.
- 2. Subject to paragraphs 3 and 4, a person who -
  - (a) imports into Namibia wheat or white maize seeds, or agronomic products which were derived from the grinding, crushing or milling of wheat or white maize seeds; or
  - (b) purchases wheat or maize seed from a person referred to in paragraph 1, shall pay general levy of zero comma nine five percent (0,95%) on the purchase price thereof.
- 3. The levy referred to in paragraph 2 shall not be payable on the importation of -
  - (i) breakfast cereals;
  - (ii) durum wheat flour;
  - (iii) industrial or household starches;
  - (iv) maizena;

- (v) pasta (the finished product); or
- (vi) popcorn,

which were derived wholly or partly from the grinding, crushing or milling of wheat or white maize seeds.

- 4. The levies referred to in paragraphs 1 and 2 shall not be payable on the sale, importation or purchase of wheat and white maize seeds intended for planting purposes.
- 5. Any person who has paid a levy on behalf of another person, as contemplated in section 18(4) of the Agronomic Industry Act, 1992 (Act No. 20 of 1992), shall be entitled to recover the amount of that levy by deducting such amount from any amount due by him or her to the person on whose behalf the levy has been paid.
- 6. For the purposes of paragraph 2 "landed cost" means the purchase price of wheat or white maize seeds, including any taxes and duties, and transport costs to the final destination in Namibia, payable in respect thereof.
- 7. The levy referred to in paragraphs 1 and 2 shall be collected by the Board.
