IMPOSITION OF LEVY IN RESPECT OF THE HARVESTING OF MARINE RESOURCES

In terms of section 44 of the Marine Resources Act, 2000 (Act No. 27 of 2000), after consultation with the Marine Resources Advisory Council and with the approval of the Minister of Finance, I -

- (a) impose a levy for the benefit of the Fisheries Observer Fund in respect of the harvesting of marine resources as set out in the Schedule; and
- (b) withdraw Government Notice No. 10 of 15 January 2002.

- 1. A person who engages in harvesting in Namibian waters in terms of right, an exploratory right or a fisheries agreement, must pay a levy of N\$ 23.87 for each hour during which that person is engaged in such harvesting, irrespective of whether or not -
 - (a) fish has been caught; or
 - (b) a fisheries observer is on board the fishing vessel used in the harvesting.

- 2. The person referred to in paragraph 1 must pay the level referred to in that paragraph -
 - (a) to the Fisheries Observer Agency: c/o PriceWaterHouseCoopers, P O Box 12, Walvis Bay; and
 - (b) within 7 days of reporting on shore after harvesting.
